What are pathways?

 Each pathway is a group of subjects that we suggest you study



- In each pathway there are:
 - some 'core', compulsory subjects
 - some specialism subjects you can choose

Pathways

- We will recommend that your child follows one of 3 pathways:
 - Ebacc Pathway
 - Open Options Pathway
 - Access Pathway
- Based on:
 - Current progress grades
 - Attitude to learning grades
 - Key stage 2 data
 - Our knowledge of your child



The Ebacc Pathway

- English language and literature
- Maths
- Science (combined or triple)
- French and/or Spanish
- History and/or Geography
- TWO further specialism subjects



What is the English Baccalaureate?

 The English Baccalaureate (Ebacc) is a performance measure for schools, not a qualification BHCS

- The Ebacc is a set of subjects at GCSE that keeps young people's options open for further study and future careers.
- Sutton Trust research reveals that studying the EBacc can help improve a young person's performance in English and maths.

The Open Options Pathway





- English language and literature
- Maths
- Science (combined or triple)
- History, Geography, French OR Spanish
- THREE further specialism subjects

The Access Pathway

 Tailored pathway to provide support and meet students' needs BHCS

- English language and literature
- Maths
- Science
- History, Geography, French or Spanish
- Curriculum Access (1 option block)
 - Year 9: English / Maths / Achieve Award
 - Year 10/11: English
- TWO further specialism subjects

Triple Science

- Separate letter of recommendation (as well as pathways letter)
 - Excellent progress
 - Resilience and aptitude
 - Considering Science at A level
 - This would take up one of your specialism subject choices

Choosing specialism subjects

Discourage your child from choosing specialism subjects because:

BHCS

- Their friends have chosen it
- They think it will be easy
- They think it's a good option for a boy/girl
- Someone else thinks that it's a good idea
- They like the teacher they have now
- They are influenced by your likes and dislikes of particular subjects

Choosing specialism subjects

Encourage your child to...

- Think about which subjects they are good at, as this may lead to their best final results in Year 11
- Consider taking the subjects that interest them the most, as they will study them for up to 3 years
- Find out which subjects may help them with their future career

Five weeks to discuss with child and consider options.
